## **Wilkins Plant Restart:**

General Manager Kowalik, Manager of Technical Operations Coleman and Senior  
Maintenance & Operations Specialist Ravagno had a productive meeting with the DEP on  
November 26. MMLD will contract with QuietStar Industries to provide further noise  
mitigation at an estimated cost of 25K. MMLD will follow up with DEP subsequent to  
QuietStar's work being completed.

Northshore Consultants to hash out the remaining PCO's and punch list.

**NREL Study:**

General Manager Kowalik and Commissioner Tumulty will review potential public renewable energy sites and forward a list of properties to NREL to assist them with the study.
