Financial Report:

Manager of Finance Dugan distributed to and discussed with the Commission the December 2018 Final Operating Statement and the January 2019 Operating Statement.

The Purchased Power Adjustment for March 2019 remains at .27 cents per Kwh for all customers.

General Manager's Report:

Wilkins Plant Restart:

General Manager Kowalik informed the Commission that we received the DEP Approval to Resume Operation Letter on March 5, 2019. MMWEC now placing bids daily. Strategy is to continue high bid prices to stay offline until hot summer days. We have not

been called to run yet. We need to consider autostart and remote dispatch upgrades if viable. Need to develop a detailed emergency run plan.

80 Commercial Street Renovation Update:

General Manager Kowalik discussed with the Commission an update on the renovations. Total project expense to date is \$8.66 million without open PCOs. There is a March 28, 2019 meeting with all parties involved to update all. Finished items include the upper garage three south facing windows, parking lot lighting and 1st floor garbage disposal. The ChargePoint EV charger is partially installed, baseboard heating has been installed in the meter room and the lower garage linemen sink is partially installed as well. The well-water heat problems continue. Items remaining to be done include Commercial Street fencing and gate, Hammond Park fencing, substation air conditioning, north wall extend gutters to full length and entry rails. The FEMA or MA CZM reimbursable improvements are currently on hold.

MMWEC Pooled Loan Financing:

General Manager Kowalik discussed with the Commission an update on the MMWEC Pooled Loan Financing. MMWEC provides a pool of funds for members to borrow on, the total pool is around \$27 million of which MMLD is in for \$4.5 million on the 80 Commercial Street Renovation Project. The MMWEC closing date for the financing was March 22, 2019.

NREL Renewable Energy Optimization:

General Manager Kowalik discussed with the Commission an update on NREL. NREL has agreed to our terms on the signed agreement two weeks ago. We just need to collect some information on our end to move along in the process.

Other Renewable Energy Initiatives:

General Manager Kowalik informed the Commission that there has been no change or no further information on the DOER MLD Solar Program.

General Manager Kowalik informed the Commission that there has been some information on the DOER EVIP Public Charging Program. The program is for smart chargers for EVs to be placed at up to nine locations. This is a three year grant program with two chargers at each location. The grant is for \$12,000 per station.

Glover Landing-records request status:

General Manager Kowalik informed the Commission that he has been looking over the Glover Landing records request from Nicholas Mango and Elizabeth Garthe-Elmwood Road, Swampscott and that we gave an easement map only and will not go any further into it.

General Manager Kowalik also informed the Commission that we are all done with the records request from Daniel Albert as well.
