Minutes

Chairman Hull opened the meeting at 4:10 P.M.

Reorganization:

Chairman Hull thanked Commissioner Tumulty for his six years of service as an MMLD Commissioner. Chairman Hull also welcomed recently elected Commissioner Lisa Wolf.

Minutes:

Commissioner Wolf requested to amend the NREL section of the May 28, 2020 minutes by adding "and to increase renewables in MMLD's energy portfolio" at the end of the first sentence and added the last sentence "A summary of the NREL report will be made available on MMLD's website. The May 28, 2020 minutes will be approved at the July meeting. <u>Unanimous</u>

Financial Report:

Finance Assistant Barrett forwarded to the Commission via electronic files of the April 2020 operating statement, the May 2020 accrued operating statement and the April 2020 power costs.

The Purchased Power Adjustment for June 2020 is 3.1 cents per Kwh for all customers.

Citizen's Proposed Articles:

Commissioner Hull solicited the Commissioner's opinions with respect to taking positions on citizen sponsored articles. The general consensus was that there was no need to unilaterally object to taking a position on articles and that the commission would address articles if deemed necessary.

General Manager's Report:

Covid-19:

General Manager Kowalik updated the Commissioners on the Covid-19 response more specifically that distribution and technical services are returning to full staff on Monday July, 6. There will be PPE and disinfectant available to each employee. The main lobby will be reopened to public on Monday, July 6. There will be weekly fogging of the plant and trucks. MMLD will continue to follow the Marblehead DOH and Mass guidelines.

Village 13

General Manager updated the Commissioners on the Village 13 upgrade more specifically the cancellation of the bid award to Virginia Transformer for two (2) 18/24/30 MVA 22.9 – 13.2kV power transformers and the switchgear contract to Eaton for \$1,174,787. The cancellation was due to SESD infrastructure under the right of way that was to be used for the delivery of the transformers. General Manager Kowalik will consult with SESD engineering to discuss their sewer main replacement and formulate a plan for the delivery of the transformers before sending out the invitation for bids. The storage containers will need to be moved to another location to permit the necessary space for battery storage. MMLD will discuss the school departments unused property on Tioga Way which in currently zoned unclassified/industrial.

Causeway Lights:

General Manager Kowalik informed the Board that MMLD will be replacing the poles and lights on the causeway. The lights will be replaced with LED's a sample to be installed next week. The poles will remain at the same height, but made with material that can better withstand the continuous exposure to saltwater.

Bell/Gerry School:

The General Manager Kowalik and Technical Operations Manager Coleman have been in discussion with the general contractor on how to supply the new building. The location for the distribution and whether it will be underground or overhead are to be determined.
